The American System:

• series of projects meant to help make the U.S. economically self-sufficient

Cumberland Road:

- 1^{st} road built by the federal gov't (1815 1818)
- Ran from Cumberland, Maryland to Wheeling, West Virginia
- 66 foot wide, 12 − 18in deep roadbed
- made w/ shovels & pick axes, filled w/ crushed stone
- also called the National Road
- made transportation easier, thus helped the economy
- 1833 expanded to Ohio, 1850 to Illinois
- Total 600 miles long Baltimore, MD to Vandalia, IL
