Much harder than Ellis Island	2% denied entry-sent home

Immigration Laws

Q Chinese Exclusion Act 1882:

Banned all Chinese, except: students, teachers, merchants tourists & gov officials

Gentlemen's Agreement: 1907-1908

Between Teddy Roosevelt & Japan gov - limit Japanese coming to USA in return for Not segregating Japanese kids in school.

Economic: What's the problem?

Decrease in wages & # of jobs

Social:

Refusal to learn language + religion = threatens way of life

Q Assimilation: Definitions

A minority group's adoption of the dominant culture/beliefs

Q Melting pot:

Blend of cultures that abandon their culture to make new one
