Notes for Slave Codes and Culture

Vocabulary

Antebellum – occurring *before* a particular *war* (especially the American Civil War)

Slave Codes - laws meant to keep slaves from *running away* or *rebelling*

Capital Punishment - punishable by death or death penalty

Examples of Slave Codes:

- Slaves could not gather in *groups* larger than *three*.
- Slaves could not *leave* their owner's land without a *pass*.
- Slaves could not own *guns*.
- Slaves could not *testify* in *court*.
- It was *illegal* for slaves to learn how to *read* or *write*.
